SUBMISSIONS / REVIEWS

The Minimum Resources Agreement, which governs the minimum resource rights of all full time research students at Victoria University, is currently being renegotiated. Vice Provost (Research) Kate McGrath is chairing the review committee, and an Interim MRA was signed as of December 2017 (currently available on our website). Once the full (5 year) agreement is final, the PGSA will distribute the updated version to all members, and the website copy will be updated.

The PGSA Submitted on the University Library Change Proposal in November 2017. We gathered information from the postgraduate community, and praised the library for their good reputation among postgraduates. The main purpose of our submission was to oppose the proposal to remove the role of Subject Librarians. During our verbal consultation with fellow students, we found that postgraduates value their Subject Librarians highly, and that they perform a highly valued service for research students. When the Change Proposal was revised, Subject Librarians were retained.

EVENTS

O Week

Postgraduate Orientation Evening 26.02.2018

This event was run in conjunction with the Student Recruitment and Orientation Office and was designed to welcome new postgraduate students at all levels into the university. We had around 100 students in attendance in HMLT205, and had a great programme including a panel of current postgrads talking about their experiences so far. Following the formal session, we had drinks and nibbles at Milk & Honey which was a great success.

Tuesday Chats (O Week Edition) 27.02.2018

For O Week we ran an additional instalment of Tuesday Chats, which is an afternoon tea standing date usually held on the First Tuesday of each month at VicBooks Pipitea. It was very popular, with around 15 people in attendance.

PGSA Summer Picnic 28.02.2018

The inaugural Summer Picnic was very successful, with around 80 students in attendance. We hosted it in our wet-weather alternative location of the Hub Courtyard (instead of Kelburn Park). Despite the last-minute location change, it was a great success. We had board games, giant Jenga, giant K'Nex, ball games, and a chemical worm-making activity. We invited people to bring their own food, and the PGSA put on hot chip butties and fruit.

First Fridays (O Week Edition) 2.03.2018

Our usual First Fridays event happened to occur in O Week, and was a popular event despite being at the tail end of the week. We has around 15 people in attendance

Kelburn Welcome Festival 2.03.2018

For the first time, the PGSA ran a stall at the Kelburn Welcome Festival. The demographic was mostly undergraduate students, and we found ourselves only rarely interacting with postgraduate students.

The event was a great success. It was pleasing to see the great variety of student research awarded research excellence awards – special congratulations to our own Pascarn Dickinson for his award. The event would not have been possible without the enthusiasm and efforts of Fran Denton, who worked wonders considering that, along with the entire Executive, she had never been to a Victorias Awards ceremony. The PGSA Executive were a wonderful help on the night, and served as excellent ambassadors for our association.
